#worldclass project example

Virtual community garden project

We live in a block of flats with no gardens. Some of the pensioners in our block love their window box displays on their balconies but they can't get any plants to replant for Spring. Based on a 'design your own garden' programme I found, I created a programme that everyone in our flats can log on to, and garden together in the virtual garden. I have put in a facility so people can chat while they are gardening. I have 54 people who regularly garden. This makes the world better for people who live in our flats, particularly the pensioners.

The making of my project shows I

What will I get if I do this?

#worldclass project example

Garden bird feeder project.

We live in our house with grandpa. He can't even go outside into our garden. We used to have a bird feeder but we don't have one any more. He loves looking at the birds. I drew up a project plan for a bird feeder, and decided to make the feeder out of lego. I researched how to create bird feed out of plants from the garden and kept it stocked with bird food. On my phone, I set up a WhatsApp group for grandpa's friends who have a phone. I filmed the bird feeder everyday, with the birds going backwards and forwards, create videos and send them to his friends. This makes the world a better place for my grandpa, all his friends and the birds.

The making of it shows I

13. am a credible researcher, because I had to thoroughly research materials that I could create a bird feeder from, and which we had available in the house already.

- show that you have significantly improved the four #worldclass skills and competencies that you needed to be better at

For silver

We are looking for projects which

- achieve entry level and bronze *and in addition*
- have significantly transformed the lives of others for the better

For gold

We are looking for projects which

- achieve entry level, bronze and silver *and in addition*
- are unique, and innovative and role model what #worldclass is, globally

#worldclass project example

Science project

I was predicted the highest grade in my science exams. I therefore decided to run a course of science sessions for the Year 10s for their home learning. I don't have a laptop at home, so I filmed all the lessons on my phone. I spoke to the Year 10 science teachers and planned with them what sessions I should run. I researched what materials I could use to show the Year 10s how to do safe experiments at home. I had really high subscription to my sessions, from Year 10s who don't even go to my school. 7. understand the importance of learning from mistakes and build up resilience because at first I suggested sessions that the teachers were not happy with, and I felt really knocked back and defensive. But, once I listened properly to them, I learned how to work with them professionally, in a team.
