# App assessment

How do you determine whether a student is World Class or not, using the app?

It is up to the school to determine their own internal benchmarks for what constitutes a student achieving a characteristic to a World Class standard. However, if a school wants to move from subscription to accreditation, then WCSQM assesses a sample of students' app usage. In order to determine whether a student has evidenced a characteristic/ area to a World Class standard, WCSQM will take into consideration the following

#### A. Characteristics

#### The evidence

- 1. demonstrates that the student thoroughly understands what the characteristic really means in its entirety
- 2. proves all aspects of the characteristic
- 3. easily proves the characteristic and has not been distorted or over exaggerated
- 4. demonstrates student agency, in that it was the student who exercised the characteristic, and not someone else in their group/ class etc.
- 5. is original, not a repeat of the example and not duplicated elsewhere to prove another characteristic in the same area or another area
- 6. has been gathered during the time the individual has been a student at the school, or within the last two years (unless the individual has joined the school in-year)
- 7. is completed by the student themselves, in their own words

## B. Area (each and all)

### The evidence

- 8. is as outlined in A. for the majority of characteristics
- 9. is taken from a broad range of experiences, events and activities etc.
- 10. reflects an individual who has the capacity to flourish in a global economy and change the world for the better.
